Project Background and History



- Background: Yachats is subject to potential natural disasters such as: earthquakes and tsunamis. To prepare for a Cascadia Event, local governments are establishing caches of emergency basic survival supplies for the benefit of survivors to stabilize and supplement until outside agencies can bring supplies from unaffected areas.
 - City of Yachats recognizes many visitors and citizens will be displaced during a Cascadia event and desires to accumulate short term disaster supplies to stabilize and supplement survivors in a secure means and in a relatively survivable location outside of the tsunami inundation zone
 - Supplies will consist of water, shelter, food, communications, warmth, sanitation and basic first aid
- History: City currently has two community emergency basic survival supply caches
 - North side cache is located on Radar Road – this cache needs supplies refurbished and added to (current supplies aren't sufficient to support basic needs listed above)
 - South side cache is located on site with Water Tower – this cache needs replacement due to rust and humidity intrusion and supplies need refurbishing and additions (current supplies aren't sufficient to support basic needs listed above)
- Due to the growth of Yachats by both permanent residents and visitors, we propose enhancing existing and adding additional emergency supply caches to support a larger percentage of the community should a catastrophic disaster occur
 - Adding two additional caches and updating existing caches would provide basic survival supplies for approximately 800 people for 2-3 days
 - Summertime estimates of residents and visitors are in the area of 2-3K people on any given day
- Implementation of this project is one aspect of a larger complete Disaster Emergency Response plan that should address the following areas: Disaster Prevention, Preparedness, Response, Recovery and Mitigation

City of Yachats Cascadia Event Disaster Relief Supply Cache Mission/Purpose

- **Hazards/Risks Addressed by Caches:** Post Cascadia Earthquake & Tsunami when essential utilities such as power, water, sewer, communications and food are not available
- **Purpose:** Provide immediate 2-3 day post disaster supplementation and stabilization relief for residents and visitors impacted by a Cascadia event in terms of Food, Water, Shelter, Sanitation, Basic First Aid while the city has time to regroup and set up a command center.
- **Focus/Scope:** Provide emergency supplies to supplement and stabilize surviving residents and visitors for 2 -3 days post Cascadia event
- **Target Locations:** Three locations north of Yachats River (YRFPD, Radar Rd, Cemetery), two locations south of Yachats River (water tower and TBD)
- **Note that as supply caches are disbursed post disaster, we expect city officials will have initiated a Rapid Needs Assessment to determine available resources for continued support of survivors as caches become depleted.**

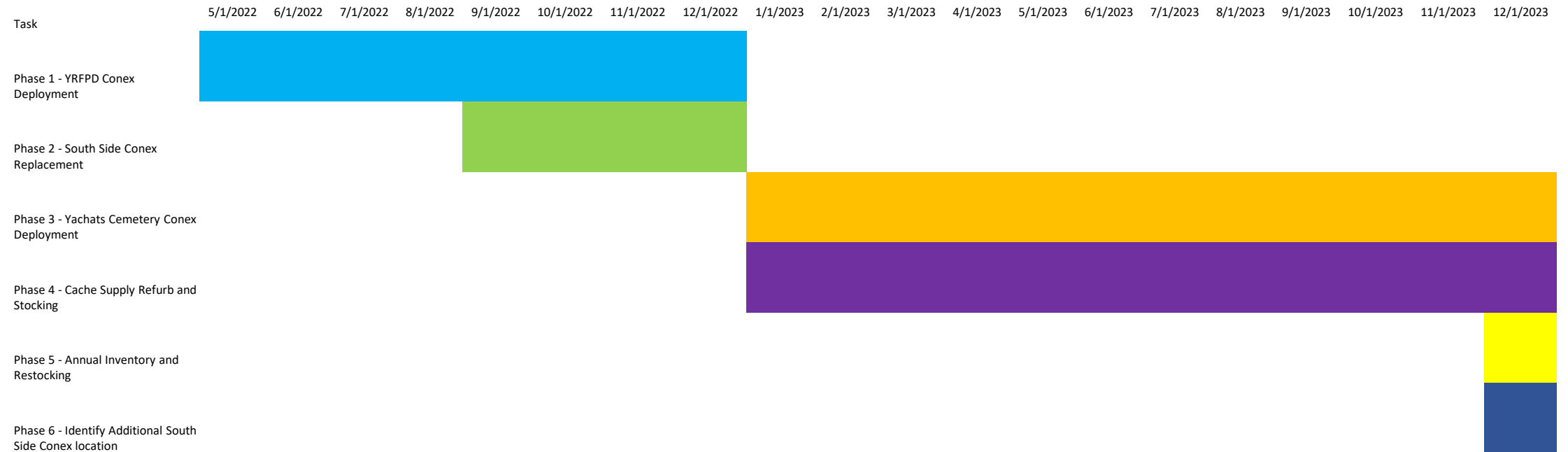


Phased Cache Deployment and Maintenance Proposal



- The Emergency Preparedness Committee is proposing a multi phase plan to expand and update our current Emergency Preparedness Supply Caches
 - **Phase 1:** Add an additional container (conex) at the Yachats Rural Fire Protection District location
 - This location is out of the inundation zone and is a gathering area for tsunami evacuations.
 - Two hotels are directly across from the fire station and would have evacuees coming from those locations
 - The owner of the Overleaf and Fireside hotel has committed to up \$6K towards the deployment and stocking of this site
 - **Phase 2:** Replace Southside cache container (conex) and refurbish supplies as needed
 - Existing conex will be removed and used as scrap metal by outside vendor
 - Supplies from existing Conex will be stored at YRFPD cache location while conex is replaced
 - **Phase 3:** Add an additional conex at the Yachats Cemetery
 - Cemetery board is okay with city placing conex at this location which is out of tsunami inundation zone
 - Goal is to try and get funding from other local hotels near to that area to pay for this cache
 - **Phase 4:** Update supplies in all Caches
 - Supplies need refurbishing and also adding to in order to meet the goals of basic survival
 - **Phase 5:** Maintenance of all supply caches with annual inspections and updates as needed
 - Conex Containers must be monitored and maintained
 - Supplies must be inventoried annually and replaced as expiration occurs
 - **Phase 6:** Identify and locate another supply cache on South side of Yachats
- Starting with YRFPD Conex Deployments allows us to store supplies from South Side Conex while replacement of that conex occurs

Community Emergency Cache Memorandum of Understanding

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Yachats Rural Fire Protection District (YRFPD) and the City of Yachats establishes principles associated with the emplacement of a twenty-foot (20') shipping container (conex) by City of Yachats on YRFPD property.

BACKGROUND: This portion of the Oregon Coast is subject to potential natural disasters such as: wildfires, earthquakes and tsunamis. To prepare for this, local governments are establishing caches of emergency basic survival supplies for the benefit of survivors until outside agencies can bring supplies from unaffected areas. YRFPD has been accumulating such supplies for many years. City of Yachats also desires to accumulate such supplies in a secure means and in a relatively survivable location. YRFPD currently has adequate space near its main fire station at 2056 Highway 101 N for a twenty foot long shipping container (conex) and outside of the tsunami inundation zone.

AGREEMENT: YRFPD and City of Yachats agree to the following. City of Yachats shall be allowed to place a twenty-foot conex on YRFPDs property subject to the following conditions:

- YRFPD will designate the location for the conex and will attempt to provide easy access without compromising access to and around YRFPD facilities by YRFPD vehicles.
- If it becomes necessary to move the conex, for building maintenance or other YRFPD determined reason, such move will be coordinated with City of Yachats and paid by YRFPD.
- City of Yachats shall retain sole ownership of the conex and anything stored therein.
- YRFPD assumes no responsibility for protecting either the conex or its contents.
- Each party to this agreement will ensure that the other is covered by party's liability insurance and will provide proof of same within 15 days of the effectivity of this MOU.
- City of Yachats will have unlimited access to the conex through prearranged dates and times, so as not to interfere with YRFPD operations.
- YRFPD can limit the amount and type of flammable liquids or corrosives to be stored in said conex. YRFPD retains absolute sole right to determine if something is a hazard, even if not listed above, and, if it is so determines, City of Yachats agrees to remove it at once.
- City of Yachats will provide YRFPD a copy of the latest inventory of the conex.

- City of Yachats shall provide YRFPD with key(s) to the conex. YRFPD will endeavor to notify City of Yachats in advance whenever it deems a need to enter the conex, unless an emergency exists.
- Both parties agree that the purpose of the cache of supplies is for emergency lifesaving activities and these supplies will be used as needed in the event of such a disaster.
- City of Yachats intends to equip the conex with heat and/or dehumidification. YRFPD will provide access to a 120 volt AC outlet and the use of electricity for this purpose. City of Yachats will reimburse YRFPD at the rate of \$60 (sixty dollars) per month toward said costs, subject to annual revision to reflect the cost of electricity. This number is based on the average monthly cost for the City of Yachats south conex location.
- YRFPD will endeavor to be a good landlord and will endeavor to advise the City of Yachats of any possible issues with the conex, specifically including a loss of electrical power.

EFFECTIVITY AND CANCELLATION: This MOU will become effective upon approval by both parties. This MOU can be canceled by either party, by notifying the other, in writing. If canceled by YRFPD, City of Yachats will be provided sixty (60) days to move said conex from YRFPD property.
