Mayor's Message

It seems like it's been a long, cold, wet winter but cheer up – Daylight Savings Time starts Sunday, March 10 so things should begin to improve.

In February, your City Council approved some modifications to the structure of the Finance Committee, essentially restoring the original structure of including one representative from each of our Commissions, a representative from the City Council, one from the Budget Committee, and other citizen volunteers with some background in the financial arena.

The Council appointed Lance Bloch, John Purcell and Dawn Keller to the Budget Committee, and also filled the remaining vacancies on the Planning Commission, Parks & Commons Commission, and Public Works & Streets Commission, so our Commissions are all back to full strength at this point.

The Council also heard comments from our hotel owners and managers, as well as vacation rental property managers, on a proposed 1% increase in the transient rental tax. A number of suggestions were offered for consideration instead of an increase, and the Council will begin discussions related to that topic at our first meeting in March.

This last month I met with Mayors and Council representatives from other cities in Lincoln

County, along with representatives from the League of Oregon Cities, USDA lending, and Business Oregon (we have the loan on the South Tank through them). We discussed the problems each of us are facing and brainstormed about how we can best deal with those challenges. We also had our bi-monthly meeting of all seven Lincoln County Mayors. It's a great format for a healthy exchange of ideas, concerns, and information.

Our March 20 Council meeting will be the annual joint meeting of our City Council and the County Commissioners. If you've not yet sat in on a meeting of the Board of Commissioners, it doesn't get any easier since it's here in Yachats.

Then on March 29 and 30, the Library is having their annual book sale in the Commons Multi-Purpose Room, so plan to stock up on your reading material for the next year. It's always a packed event, and draws a big crowd of book lovers from all over the Central Oregon Coast.

Summary of Recent Council Activity

The Council took the following actions in February 2019:

- Appointed Councilor Tooke to represent the Council on the Finance Committee
- Appointed Councilor Glenn and City Planner Mattison to serve on the Lincoln County Housing Project
- Appointed Councilor Tooke (primary) and Mayor Moore (secondary) to the Cascades West Area Commission on Transportation
- Appointed Craig Berdie to the Parks and Commons Commission
- Appointed Loren Dickinson to the Planning Commission
- Appointed Ron Urban, Tom Fisher, and Ann Stott to the Public Works and Streets Commission
- Appointed Lance Bloch, John Purcell, and Dawn Keller to the Budget Committee
- Approved a ballot measure for the May 21, 2019 elections on updates to the City Charter
- Approved the Comprehensive Plan updates recommended by the Planning Commission
- Appointed the City Manager as the City's Budget Officer
- Authorized the City Manager to use as needed accounting and planning services from the Oregon Cascades West Council of Governments
- Authorized the City Manager to use the Oregon Cooperative Procurement Program to assist with procurement and contracting on City projects
- Approved to have OLCC proceed with processing a liquor license for Beach Street Kitchen
- Approved changes to the Yachats Municipal Code Chapter 3.10 on the Finance Committee and Capital Improvement Planning
- Approved the City to pursue grant funding from the Oregon Health Authority to develop a water source protection plan
- Received public input on a proposed 1% increase on the Transient Lodging Tax

City Charter Update

City Council approved three updates to the City Charter which will be on the May 21, 2019 general election ballot for Yachats voters. All of these updates follow the model language recommended by the League of Oregon Cities.

1. Clarification of quorum requirements: The following sentence was added to Section 12 on Quorums: In the event of a vacancy due to resignation or other events, the quorum is reduced accordingly.

2. Language for City Manager position: The Committee that evaluated the organizational structure of the City in 2016 recommended that the City move to a Manager – Council structure which combines the strong political leadership of elected officials with the strong managerial experience of a manager. This system is representative where all power is concentrated in the elected Council and where Council hires a professional manager to oversee the delivery of public services and manage the day to day operations. In 2016, the Council hired the first City Administrator, a position that combined many of the duties of the City Recorder and Public Works Director along with the administrative role that the Mayor had held. Making this update to the Charter recognizes this change in governance.

3. Formilization of the Municipal Court and Municipal Judge: the City has long retained a judge to operate a Municipal Court for violations of the Yachats Municipal Code. While the Court has not had any cases in the last several years, the City must remain able to process any citations from Code violations. The added language outlines the role of the judge and the jurisdiction of the court, including the ability of having hearings outside of the Yachats city limits.

City Projects

Ocean View Drive: The City is continuing to finalized the details of the Ocean View Drive property transfer from Lincoln County. The County is providing legal support in filing the property easement recordings. The City is waiting on the archeologist from the state to do testing, work that must be completed prior to any improvements on currently non-paved areas. These inspections are also needed to complete the new Urban Trail on the north end of the Wetlands Park. The goal is still to have the road portion of the project completed by the end of this fiscal year.

The Council is planning to have a Community Meeting on the project in late March or early April

2019. A decision on the date will be made at an upcoming Council meeting. Notice of the community meeting date and time will be published on the City's website, Facebook, posting boards, and the Commons marquee.

Multipurpose Room Flooring:



Asbestos inspections by the state indicated there was no asbestos in the tiles under the current Multipurpose Room floor. This report means work on the new floor can resume. Workers will

be installing the new Multipurpose Room floor from March 4 to March 22, 2019. During this time, the Multipurpose Room and Kitchen will be closed to the public. Classes that normally occur in these rooms are being relocated to Room 8, Room 3, or the Lions Club or being cancelled. Yoga will be held at the Lion's Club. Art in the Kitchen will move to Room 8. Ping Pong will take place in Room 8. Check with the instructor regarding other classes.

Website Redesign: The project teams of staff and residents for both the main website (CivicEngage) and the reservation module (CivicRec) are moving through the initial design input phase and beginning to focus on content. We are currently working on determining all of the information that needs to be transferred, providing Civic Plus with design ideas and photographs, and creating an intuitive and easy-to-navigate site map.

A Civic Plus consultant will be onsite to work with staff and volunteers on fine-tuning the content to best serve residents, businesses, and visitors. There will be a Community Meeting with the representative on Thursday, March 21, 2019 from 10:00 am to noon to gather feedback from the public on what you want to see on our site.

In the meantime, please email your ideas for the website to happydogs27@gmail.com. You can share links to sites you like, ideas for content, features you want, and other information of importance. If you share a site link, please let us

know what you like about that site. You can also let us know what you definitely want to keep from our existing site. We will compile this information and send it to Civic Plus prior to the public meeting.

The anticipated launch date for the new site is June 24, 2019.

Little Log Church & Museum Repairs:

Damage to the foundation and structure at the Little Log Church is extensive and the City



will need to assess whether the building should be renovated or rebuilt. Water Treatment Plant Lead Rick McClung and Facilities Manager Heather Hoen are working with the engineers to send out an RFP for bids on both options.

Library Renovation: Work on a request for proposal continues and is waiting on the architect's most recent drawings.

City Hall Relocation: Preliminary sketches for relocating City Hall to the 501 Building have been received. The City Manager was able to save \$3,400 in architectural design costs by having virtual meetings with the design firm and reducing the number of design proposals. To manage costs over time, the relocation will likely happen in phases.

Great News on South Water Tank

The City received the final Closeout Letter from Business Oregon signifying that the South Water Tank Project is complete. This news brings with it a forgiveness of \$700,000 on the project loan! By meeting the project deadlines, the City's initial \$1,730,000 loan has been reduced to \$1,030,000. Additionally, because the system user rate met loan agreement standards and work was completed within 36 months, the interest rate was reduced from 2.2% to 1%.

Project costs were estimated to be \$1,247,375 (1,985,065 Construction, \$162,310 Engineering). Changes to the project regarding relocating the tank, changing the retaining wall, supporting the slope, crossing Highway 101, and adding a sewer line while the ditches were open added \$402,691 in construction and \$130,189 in engineering for a total projected cost of \$1,780,255 as of May 2018.

Subsequently, the City Manager spent considerable time improving communications with the engineer and contractor resulting in greater accountability. She was able to reduce the costs through negotiation on a collection of liquidated and special damages as a result of delays on the contractor's part.

Negotiation included:

- A 56% decrease on the waterline connections under Highway 101 saving \$10,860 (down from \$19,259)
- A 4% decrease on the wastewater line of \$7,000 (down from \$175,000)
- An 11% decrease on engineering & project management of \$5,941 (down from \$54,000)
- \$25,041 of overall engineering/project management services

Thanks to Manager Beaucaire's hard work, the final cost to the City for this project dropped from the projected \$1,780,255 to \$1,730,000. With the \$700,000 in loan forgiveness, the City will repay \$1,030,000 over 30 years at 1% interest.

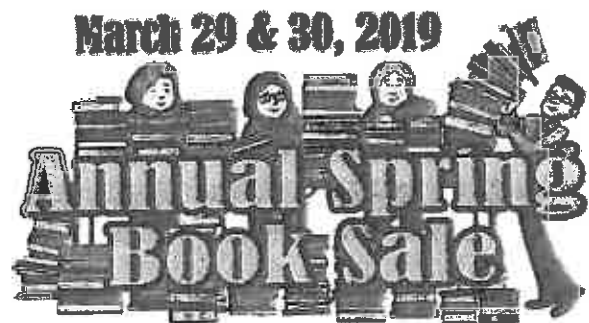

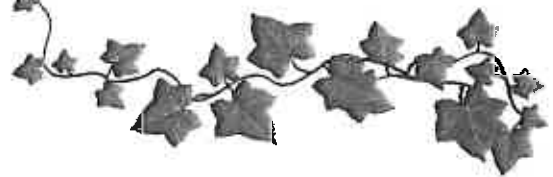

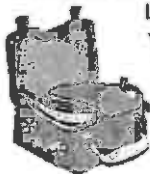
