## **Mayor's Message**

It's May already, and hopefully we'll see some more sun and a little less rain this month. At our Council meeting on April 17<sup>th</sup>, the Council took public input on Ocean View Drive once again, now that we're getting close to paving and striping (May or June 2019). We had a much smaller turnout than we did last May, but almost all of the people there had also attended last year's meeting, and were still pretty much in agreement on the stretch from the State Park to 7<sup>th</sup> Street, but some differences of opinion were voiced on the section along the river between Pontiac and the State Park. The Council will be taking up this discussion at our meeting on May 1<sup>st</sup>.

We will also be starting our discussions about single use plastics and vacation rentals, although we will not be voting on either of the last two at the May 1<sup>st</sup> meeting – it's just preliminary discussion. You may recall in 2017, the City Council implemented a two year trial period for a limit on vacation rentals, and that time limit is coming up later this year, so it's time to bring it back to the table.

Last month, the Council authorized the City Manager to enter into an agreement with Springbrook for financial software to replace our current system. The City Manager has negotiated hard on the pricing to make it affordable for a small City, and the ongoing costs for this system are now pretty much

cost-neutral compared with the system we currently have in use. The Council also approved the updated Emergency Operations Plan prepared by the Emergency Preparedness Committee.

The Budget Committee will be meeting this month to finalize our Fiscal Year 2019-2020 budget, so that will be good to have it taken care of.

I want to say "Thank You" to all the volunteers that have stepped up to fill all of our Commission and Committee vacancies in recent months. Once again, the citizen participation in Yachats has been great.

## Summary of Recent Council Activity

The Council took the following actions in May 2019:

- Proclaimed April 2019 as Sexual Assault Awareness Month and Child Abuse Prevention Month in the City of Yachats.
- Received input from nine members of the public on the traffic flow on Oceanview Drive.
- Discussed banning single use plastic bags with Dahl Disposal representative, Chuck Lerwick.
- Discussed revitalizing the City's Chamber of Commerce.
- Continued to review the Council Rules.
- Authorized the City Manager to engage in a contract with Springbrook for new financial software.
- Discussed an audit of water rates.
- Heard from Public Works that engineering for E 2<sup>nd</sup> and W 1<sup>st</sup> Streets was complete and could now issue the RFP for paving.
- Approved the Emergency Operations Plan revision.
- Appointed Bob Webb to the Budget Committee.
- Received information from Michelle Korgan on the use of City support for and the growth and success of YYFAP.

## Code Enforcement

It's mid-spring in Yachats! The daylight hours are longer. The temperatures are rising. It's time to get out and take care of your yard.



- \* Remember to trim/prune any bushes and trees you have so they don't creep over onto your neighbor's property.
- \* Keep those hedges and bushes at a height of 3 feet in the front yard (the street side).
- \* For clear vision, on corner lots or driveways, keep the hedges at 2 1/2 feet high for a distance of 10 feet back from the street for driveways and 15 feet for street corners. In these areas keep your trees trimmed so the branches remain above 8 feet as well.

- \* And keep that lawn mowed.

## May 21 Election - City Charter Update

The City reminds you that there will be a public vote on the adoption of a revised City Charter in the May 21, 2019 election.

The City Council is proposing three updates to the City Charter. All of these updates follow the model language recommended by the League of Oregon Cities.

**1. Clarification of quorum requirements:** The following sentence was added to Section 12 on Quorums: In the event of a vacancy due to resignation or other events, the quorum is reduced accordingly.

**2. Language for City Manager position:** The Committee that evaluated the organizational structure of the City in 2016 recommended that the City move to a Manager – Council structure which combines the strong political leadership of elected officials with the strong managerial experience of a manager. This system is representative where all power is concentrated in the elected Council and where Council hires a professional manager to oversee the delivery of public services and manage the day to day operations. In 2016, the Council hired the first City Administrator, a position that combined many of the duties of the City Recorder and Public Works Director along with the administrative role that the Mayor had held. Making this update to the Charter recognizes this change in governance.

**3. Formalization of the Municipal Court and Municipal Judge:** the City has long retained a judge to operate a Municipal Court for violations of the Yachats Municipal Code. While the Court has not had any cases in the last several years, the City must remain able to process any citations from Code violations. The added language outlines the role of the judge and the jurisdiction of the court, including the ability of having hearings outside of the Yachats city limits.

## City Projects

**Ocean View Drive:** The County is in the process of finalizing plans to pave Oceanview Drive, re-sleeve the 9 culverts under the road, and improve the 804 Trail base to occur in May or June 2019. The City wants to ensure that residents get plenty of notice on when work will occur. Work on the guard rails is contingent upon the archeological analysis.

The Council took input from the public on traffic flow and will be discussing that input at their May 1, 2019 meeting.

**Website Redesign:** The main website, Civic Engage, and the facilities management software, Civic Rec, are proceeding on schedule. The City has completed the process of providing the content for the site which is currently being incorporated into the new design. Facilities Manager Heather Hoen and Clerk Kimmie Jackson have completed the setup of Civic Rec, which will be put into use in this month. Staff will migrate the scheduled events to Civic Rec and that program will go live to the public in June. Staff is continuing to make existing documents ADA compliant.

Staff should have non-published access to edit content beginning in late May. Departments, Commissions, and Committees that contributed content will also have a chance to modify their information in May or early June.

The anticipated launch date for the new site is the end of June 2019.

**Little Log Church & Museum Repairs:** For some history of the Little Log Church and Museum building, the Little Log Church walls are made from natural logs, setting on a post and beam foundation system. The original log structure was completed in 1930. Modifications to the exterior church walls were made in the mid-1990s, which consisted of replacing selected wall logs with the new peeled logs. The attached museum structure has walls made from log siding material. The museum foundation has a concrete stem wall and footing around the perimeter, and interior post and beam floor support. There is a crawl space access on one side of the building, with a narrow opening for access. The City has recently received information that the rot may be more extensive

than previously understood. The full engineer's analysis is in the document library labeled, "LLC&M Engineers Analysis."

**City Entrance Signs:** Newport Signs is nearing completion of the new City entrance signs. They will be installed as soon as the work is finished.



**Library Expansion/Renovation:** The City is drafting the RFP for the 400 square foot addition and remodel of the current building.



**Lincoln County Housing Strategy:** City Planner Dave Mattison was appointed to the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) for a regional housing initiative between Lincoln County and the Oregon Department of Land Conservation and Development. Mattison reported from the April 2019 meeting that telephone interviews with over a dozen different organizations and stakeholders about affordable housing and rehabilitation loan programs. He also reported there were suggestions to revive partnerships with the Home Rehab Loan program. The final report will be completed by June 30, 2019.

Many memories have been made at the Little Log Church & Museum over the last 90 years – weddings, memorials, family gatherings, poetry readings, concerts, and more. It's a living testimony to Yachats then, now, and the future. A very special memory was made last Easter Sunday in the garden of St. Francis of Assisi in the form of a dedication of a dogwood tree donated by the family of Dr. Esther Palmer and planted in her memory.

There are many varieties of dogwood. Ours is called, "Eddie's White Wonder," and seems to do well in the Pacific Northwest. It's just a baby. We will enjoy seeing it mature and thrive.

Esther Palmer's family thought planting a tree in her memory was a fitting tribute to her. Dr. Palmer was an herbalist, a lifelong gardener, and naturopathic doctor. She was also a member of "The Incredibles" – the historic team that designed and built the first Boeing 747. She lived in the Puget Sound area for most of her life, and later moved to California to be closer to her daughter and granddaughter. She brought her family to Yachats as often as she could, for she loved this little village. The Little Log Church was always on her itinerary, and she made sure she came during the annual Celtic festivals, which she loved. She passed away September 4, 2018 at the age of 93. Her memorial service was held at the Little Log Church last October.

In keeping with acknowledging the Little Log Church & Museum as a repository of memories past, present and future, the family requested that a time capsule be placed on the property. The capsule is a WWII ammunitions box, and contains items honoring Dr. Palmer, some historic mementos from the Little Log Church & Museum, as well as small tokens from local businesses (notes, business cards, local maps and menus, etc.) – a veritable potpourri of who we are today. The items were wrapped in special material that will help preserve them, and covered with a sheet of

beeswax for extra protection. A letter was written to whoever will open the time capsule in 100 years. A map and instructions will be retained by the Little Log Church & Museum. An exhibit will be created at the museum to tell future generations the story of this remarkable woman and the treasures of the past, present and future that reside here.

**Yachats Pride – May 31-June 2, 2019**



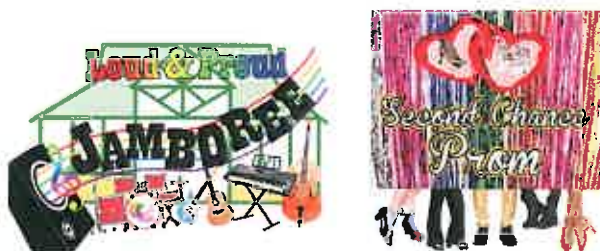
