Mayor's Message

Just yesterday (August 22), newly appointed City Councilor Craig Berdie and I attended the annual Oregon Coastal Caucus Economic Summit. Joining over a thousand people from government, industry, and citizen advocacy, including our Oregon Senators by Skype and every State Legislator whose "territory" touches the Pacific Ocean, we learned about and discussed the critical issues surrounding climate change and what to do with the challenges presented by carbon. The event was hosted by the Confederated Tribes of Siletz Indians at the Chinook Winds Casino. If this topic interests you, you might contact either Craig or myself.

I want to thank the Parks and Commons Commission for all the work they did revising the Yachats Commons Policy Manual. In reviewing this document in its August 8 Meeting, the City Council set aside two specific questions in the hope of encouraging citizens and others to let the Council know their views. The two questions are: (1) should the City of Yachats continue formally encouraging users of the Commons and all City properties to refrain from using plastic water or soda bottles (a position adopted in 2011)? and (2) should the City allow all paid security staff with proper permits and certifications to carry firearms in the Commons, or should that allowance be restricted to Law Enforcement security? The City Council will discuss these questions in its Work Session on September 5 at 9:30 am, and vote on them in its Regular Meeting on September 12 at 6:00 pm. That will give all citizens and others two opportunities, namely at these two meetings, to express their opinions and recommendations.

In a recent email to me Councilor Max Glenn told me of a glowing report he had received concerning the work of the Yachats Youth and Family Program. As YYFAP completes another wonderful many-faceted summer program for our children, I want to thank YYFAP's entire staff and volunteers and shout out a particular thanks to Alice Beck, YYFAP's director. May we continue to support her and her work in every way we can.

Finally, at the September 5 Council meeting, the City of Yachats will be honoring South Lincoln Resources as they celebrate 35 years of outreach to people in need from Seal Rock south to Yachats. The actual celebration at their home base will be on Sunday, September 9, from 1:00 to 4:00 pm.

Public Works

During the months of September and October, weather and work schedules permitting, Public Works will be smoke testing north of the bridge in selected areas.

This is an ongoing process of identifying Infiltration and Inflow (I&I) of ground water and surface water into the sewer collection system. This is accomplished in a couple different ways.

We will be isolating sections of the system and “smoke testing” that area. This is the method of blowing non-toxic smoke into the isolated area and identifying where it comes out.

If the “smoke” comes out the building roof vents, that tells us all is well at that particular location. If the “smoke” comes out of a down spout, then we know roof drains are illegally connected to the sanitary system and must be removed. If the smoke appears to find its way up through the ground then we know there are cracks or breaks in sewer laterals or sewer mains and must be repaired.

The second way we check for I&I is by cleaning sewer mains and then running a camera down them to actually look at televised pictures of the inside of the sewer main lines and locate where sewer laterals connect to the sewer main. Once again we isolate that particular area to do the work and make note of any cracks, low points, breaks, or misaligned pipes. We also identify ground & surface water intrusions. We monitor distance from manhole to come back and make repairs.

Prior to doing this work we will notify neighborhoods that will be affected. We will also notify property owners of any problems that need to be addressed.

Water Restrictions in Effect



Due to the lack of precipitation it is necessary that the City of Yachats enter Phase 1 of our Water Conservation Actions. A prolonged drought may result in

additional restrictions.

It may be necessary for the City to purchase water from another provider. If that happens a service charge will be added to the current water rate to cover the added expense.

For more information about the emergency regulations please see the Yachats Municipal Code, Chapter 8.22

Phase 1 Requirements

1. The watering of lawns, gardens and landscaping is restricted to alternative days. Specifically, houses with an address number ending in even numbers (0-2-4-6-8) shall water lawns only on even numbered calendar days. Houses with an address number ending in odd numbers (1-3-5-7-9), or fractional addresses, shall water only on odd numbered calendar days. All watering of lawns, gardens and landscaping shall be prohibited between the hours of 10:00 am and 7:00 pm of each day.
2. All sales of water to persons who are not customers of the water system are prohibited.
3. No water shall be used by the Yachats Rural Fire District for drills, fire hose testing, hydrant flushing or truck washing.
4. The operation of an ornamental fountain, unless it is equipped with a recirculation system, is prohibited.

Burn Ban and Outdoor Fire Permits

A full burn ban remains in effect for the Yachats area. The State has issued a closure of all open fire on beaches. **Lincoln County has a temporary ban on open flame pits and the**

outdoor burning of all wood and charcoal, including wood and charcoal grills. If your grill does not have a valve to turn off the flame, you should not use it.

The Yachats Fire Department reminds that permits are required for using back yard fire pits and cooking over an open flame (when ban is not in effect). It is very important that Yachats Fire has an up to date list of permits so we can monitor proper clearances and be able to notify permit holders of closures. There is no charge for the permits and they can be renewed over the phone by calling 541-547-3266.
